SCORING

400 POINTS TOTAL - So:

a score of "300" = 75% (C)

YOUR FINAL EXAM WILL COMPRISE 20% OF YOUR FINAL GRADE FOR THE COURSE.

25% SLIDE IDENTIFICATIONS (100 pts): * no notes

You will be given 5 Slide ID questions, worth 20 points each. For each question, a slide will be projected onscreen for 5 minutes. For each, you must provide:

- 1.) The name of the photographer (5 points)
 - 2.) The title of the image (5 points)
 - 3.) The date of the image (3 points)
 - 4.) A 2-3 sentence discussion of the image (7 points)

10% MC QUESTIONS W/ VISUAL AIDES (40 pts): * no notes

You will be given 8 "Visual Aid Multiple Choice" questions, worth 5 points each. For each question, an image or set of images will be provided. You will be required to answer the mc questions (***one correct answer only***) that correspond to the images. No partial points here.

Example Question:

This image is clearly the work of a:

- a.) Pictorialist
- b.) Modernist
- c.) Daguerreotypist
- d.) Gum Bichromate artist



10% PHOTOGRAPHIC VOCABULARY (40 pts): * no notes

You will be asked to define 8 terms in your own words, worth 5 points each. All terms will come from your Final Exam Review Packet. Partial points are possible here.

25% “CHECK ALL THAT APPLY” QUESTIONS (100 points):

*** notes allowed**

You will be given 10 “check all that apply” answers, following the same format as the majority of your quiz questions. Each question, worth 10 points, will have five possible choices. 2 points will be deducted for each correct choice not checked (or each incorrect choice checked), so partial points are possible here.

30% SHORT ESSAYS (120 points):

*** notes allowed**

You will be required to complete 2 one-page short essays. You will be given 5 essay question choices, and you may choose 2 of the 5 that you feel best equipped to answer. Each essay will be worth a total of 60 points. Points will be deducted for failure to address key issues or for incorrect attributions / information. Points will *not* be deducted for spelling and grammatical errors, though you should keep in mind that concise, precise, and well crafted writing is always best for getting your points across effectively.

Final exam questions will be based on materials covered during the in-class lectures, all of which are available online, as well as the contents of assigned readings completed during the semester in the main text and in PDFs provided on the class website. **Your CORRECTED QUIZZES, as mentioned in class, should also prove to be invaluable tools for final exam study.** In addition, you will be supplied in class (and online) with a Review Packet, containing helpful materials for studying for your exam.
